Also, in the last Newsletter, we mentioned Vikki who is a maternity nurse and midwife who lives in our link parish of St. Matthew's. She has been a good friend to us ever since our link started and has, on several occasions, provided accommodation for visitors from Wivelsfield.

As is so often the case in the world's poorest countries she has to buy a lot of essential supplies out of her own money – supplies which we would expect to be provided by the State. This often even includes rubber gloves.

For some time we have been discussing the possibility of supporting Vikki financially and we are glad to be able to tell you that we now have a scheme in place.

We have arranged through Western Union to periodically transfer fund to Vikki to enable her to buy items for expectant mothers and women with young babies. She has already received the first donation of £70 and will be keeping in regular touch with us to let us know what progress she is making. We will keep you up to date.

It is another example of how a little from us can go a very long way in Sierra Leone.
